 - B. Students will be able to effectively complete a Periodontal Probing Evaluation based on the Central Regional Dental Hygiene Examinations, Inc. guidelines.
 - 1. 90% of students will score 11 (out of maximum 12) or higher on the Central Regional Dental Hygiene Examinations, Inc. Periodontal Probing Score (Spring Semester)
 - C. Students will be able to effectively complete Calculus Deposit Removal based on the Central Regional Dental Hygiene Examinations, Inc. criteria.
 - 1. 90% of students will score 40 or higher (out of maximum 60) on the Central Regional Dental Hygiene Examinations, Inc. Examination Scale Score (Spring Semester)
