In efforts to take the Adult Education Division to another level, Dr. West shared the vision on why career pathways are essential in meeting the needs of young people on the streets. The career pathway model is designed to get drop-outs off the streets and into the GED® classroom and/or skills-based jobs and colleges. Club members were astonished to learn the fact and pledged their support of the Adult Education Division.

The Rotary Club of Centerville has partnered with the Central Georgia Technical College Adult Education Career and Opportunity Center (CGTC-ADCOC) over the years as co-sponsor for the annual Volunteer Luncheon held each April. During the luncheon, the club president presented a check to the CGTC Foundation to provide financial support for General Education Diploma (GED®) scholarships. The scholarship fund ensures that each recipient receives a no-cost GED®.


CHEREESE CLAYTON



- Complete preparation for the GED® Test
 - Earn your GED® by scoring 145 or higher in each core area: Reading, Mathematics, Social Studies, & Science
