Leading to the Bachelor of Science in
Bachelor of Science in Family and Consumer Sciences (Infant and Child Development)

Between Central Georgia Technical College
and
Fort Valley State University

In order to provide a path for advancement for the students in Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) in pursuing their Bachelor of Science in Family and Consumer Sciences with a concentration in Infant and Child Development at (FVSU), the two parties, Central Georgia Technical College and Fort Valley State University, agree to the following:

1. Agreement in Principle

Both parties agree to work towards easing the transition from Central Technical College, SACSCOC accredited institution, to FVSU, a SACSCOC accredited institution, for students who want to pursue their Bachelor of Science in Family and Consumer Sciences with a concentration in Infant and Child Development at FVSU. The goal of the course articulation agreement between the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Early Childhood Care and Education at Central Georgia Technical College and the Bachelor of Science Degree in Family and Consumer Sciences with a concentration in Infant and Child Development program at Fort Valley State University is to facilitate the transfer of courses from CGTC to FVSU. Both parties enter into this articulation agreement as cooperating partners with their responsibilities to remain true to their institutional mission and to the spirit of this articulation agreement.

2. Agreement in Communication

Central Georgia Technical College and Fort Valley State University agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with the public release of information in their respective websites as required by USG BOR Policy Section 2.17- Concerning the Acceptance of Core Courses and Placement Test Scores from TCSG Colleges.

3. Agreement of Admission

Students at CGTC must satisfy all of the requirements for admission at FVSU. Note that for each course, students must have at least a grade of "C" for a course to be transferable. In order to be admitted to the Family and Consumer Sciences

Baccalaureate Program with a concentration in Infant and Child Development at Fort Valley State University under this agreement, the student must complete or be near completion of Central Georgia Technical College's Associate Degree in Early Childhood Education. A student transferring into the baccalaureate program may graduate under the provisions of the FVSU Catalog and requirements which were in effect when the student was accepted into the four (4) year program except when changes are mandated by external agencies such as the Board of Regents (BOR).

4. Agreement on Courses That Can Be Transferred

The courses for articulation are given in table I.

5. Duration of This Agreement

This agreement is in effect immediately and will remain in effect until such time as program changes in either college require that it be re-articulated. Central Georgia Technical College and the Family and Consumer Sciences Program with a Concentration in Infant and Child Development agree to review this document annually. Additionally, each college agrees to keep the other informed as program changes affecting this agreement occur.

The agreement may be terminated at the option of either institution following written notice of no less than six (6) months. However, all students who are currently in the program at the time of such notice of termination will be allowed to complete their baccalaureate degree.

This agreement is in effect and valid starting with the date of the signature of both Presidents and will remain in effect until terminated in writing by either institution.


