



COURSE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
JANUARY 2, 2015

Middle Georgia State College and Central Georgia Technical College agree as follows:

1. Purpose: The two institutions are entering into a Course Articulation Agreement to assist and promote the transferability in the Criminal Justice programs between the two institutions.
2. Terms: Terms of the Agreement will be effective January 2, 2015. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon giving written notice to the other party. Such notice must be given one full semester prior to the Agreement being canceled.
3. Conditions: The attachment lists the courses in the A.A.S. Criminal Justice program that will transfer from Central Georgia Technical College to Middle Georgia State College. This Agreement assures the acceptance of the courses as listed in the attachments by Middle Georgia State College.



Amendment to Course Articulation Agreement dated January 2, 2015

Criminal Justice Program (CRJU) Approved Degree, Diploma or Certificate -B.S. Criminal Justice

1. The joint program will be open to Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) graduates with an approved degree, diploma or certificate in Criminal Justice and only for candidates entering the B.S. degree in Criminal Justice at Middle Georgia State College (MGSC).
2. Effective January 2, 2015, Middle Georgia State College will accept general education courses for transfer as detailed in the articulation agreement between the University System of Georgia (USG) and the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG). Courses will only be accepted from institutions accredited by the Commission of Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).
- ~~3.~~ All Central Georgia Technical College courses transferred to Area F or to major requirements toward the Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice will be taught by SACS-COC qualified faculty.
4. Only Central Georgia Technical College courses with a grade of "C" or higher will be transferred to Area F or to major requirements toward the Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice.
5. Qualified Central Georgia Technical College graduates will be required to fulfill all of the College of Arts & Sciences' Area F requirements (18 semester hours), the College's CRJU upper level core requirements (27 semesters hours), the College's upper level CRJU electives (18 semester hours), and the School's general electives (15 semester hours).
6. The following Central Georgia Technical College courses will be accepted as transfer: **(the list may be amended by written agreement of the Deans of the schools at each college):**

7. MGSC candidates for degrees must complete a minimum of 120 semester hours of academic work with a grade point of 2.0 or better, calculated on all work attempted at MGSC. The academic work must include at least 27 semester hours of upper level core courses in the major field, at least 18 semester hours of upper level electives in the major field and at least 15 semester hours of general electives.
8. Of the 40 semester hours immediately preceding graduation, at least 30 must be taken at MGSC to include 27 hours of upper level course work in the major.
9. All University System of Georgia and MGSC requirements for graduation must be satisfied.
10. This agreement is effective for students who graduate with a degree or diploma from CGTC beginning January 2, 2015.
