INFORMATION & FAQ's

ABOUT

The Institute of Study Abroad Ireland was founded in 1996 by Dr. Niamh Hamill. A lecturer in Irish history and culture, Dr. Hamill has presented numerous study abroad programs worldwide. She earned her Ph.D. in History and Culture from Drew University in New Jersey.

COUNTY DONEGAL/BUNDORAN

Known as the surf capital of Ireland, the remote town of Bundoran is located in the extreme northwest corner of Ireland in the center of Donegal Bay. The area is characterized by dramatic landscapes of ocean and mountain, dotted with historical and cultural features. The ancient and the modern co-exist in this part of Ireland, and offer a safe, friendly and exciting experience for visitors.

ACCOMMODATIONS

The Institute of Study Abroad Ireland's facilities include the campus at Donegal Adventure Center and a separate in-town location for faculty and guests. The premises of both facilities are approved by the Irish Tourist Board and are inspected annually.

Students will stay at the Donegal Adventure Center campus in Bundoran in County Donegal, located two minutes away from the town center. Students are assigned rooms according to gender on separate floors with a vetted resident assistant, and are under 24-hour supervision.

Room sizes vary from 2-4 bedrooms per room and include an attached bathroom. All bed linen is provided and room lists are provided in advance for allocation purposes. Students can request to stay with friends if traveling together.

The campus includes large recreation rooms, kitchens, and many outdoor and indoor facilities for games. All activities are pre-approved and instructors and staff are fully qualified to supervise activities.

Each staff member is trained in child protection and is legally vetted.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ's)

Q: How much does the trip cost?

A: The price per student is \$2,750 and includes airfare, meals, accommodation, field trips, cultural entertainment, adventure activities, insurance, and equipment rentals for ten days.

Transfer from the airport to the campus is included in the cost and supervised.

**The guaranteed airfare price is for the first 24 registrants. If you do not pay a deposit and reserve a seat, the airfare price may increase closer to the departure date.*

Q: Are all meals included?

A: Meals are provided on-site and can be made to accommodate dietary needs and allergies. Vegetarian, vegan, and gluten-free options will be available.

Q: Will my child need a vaccine?

A: We recommend a tetanus booster before travel if it has been several years since your child last received one.

Q: Is there a laundry facility on campus?

A: Laundry is collected on-site. There is a charge (by weight) for this service.

COURSE REGISTRATION & PAYMENT

Course registration for HUMN 1101 begins March 11th and ends April 1st. Students should contact a CGTC High School Initiatives Coordinator to register for the course.

TRIP PAYMENT

Meals/Accommodations/Activities (\$1,550) and airfare (\$1,200) will be paid separately.

- **The \$1,200 flight price is good for the first 24 registrants.** Price may increase after the 24th registrant.
- **Payment for meals/accommodations/activities will be paid to Central Georgia Technical College.**
 - o Half of the cost for meals/accommodations/activities (**\$775**) is due by **March 1st**.
 - o **Complete payment is due by April 1st.**

AIRFARE PAYMENT

Airfare payments will be made online via the *StudentUniverse* website.

- A \$250 deposit for airfare is due by March 1st
- Complete payment is due by April 1st
- Payment installments are accepted

** Students are required to purchase trip cancellation/emergency medical care insurance. Cancellation reimbursement is only for an insured reason.*

Before departing the U.S. students will be required to submit the following documents:

- Proof of travel insurance (including outdoor sports; purchased on-line with flight)
- Completion of ISAI Health Forms
- Statement of Due Warning and Assumption of Risk Form
- Consent for Emergency Treatment Form
- Student Code of Conduct Agreement

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ's—continued)

Q: Are there church facilities?

A: Arrangements will be made for students who wish to attend Sunday services.

Q: What if my child gets sick or there is a medical emergency?

A: A trained first-aid staff member will be on duty on campus throughout the trip. There is a doctor's office in Bundoran, as well as Sligo Hospital located 25 minutes away from the campus.

If your child is sick, we will contact you immediately. Your child's medical treatment will be consulted with you first, unless a medical emergency occurs, in which you will be notified as soon as possible.

Q: What if my child gets homesick?

A: We are very experienced at dealing with homesickness, and it has never yet (in more than 20 years) endured beyond the first two days.

Q: What if there is an emergency at home?

A: We can be contacted 24/7 and will make any necessary arrangements. Please ensure your child has travel insurance which will provide for emergency travel if required.

A travel insurance policy is essential and is purchased when you pay online for airfare. It covers cancellation under certain covered circumstances.

Q: How do I register my child for the Ireland study abroad trip?

A: Immediately apply for a passport for your child. Visit www.travel.state.gov for details on applying for a passport.
