The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) is a federally funded program. WIOA funds are available for dislocated workers, low-income individuals and out-of-school youth. The funds are administered specifically through services geared toward helping disadvantaged citizens obtain meaningful employment.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. Who qualifies for WIOA assistance?
- **A.** Youth and adults attending a CGTC occupational program or enrolled in the Adult Education program.
- Q. Are there special conditions for students to be selected for WIOA?
- **A.** Students must be enrolled full-time at CGTC in select occupational programs and be living on a low-income budget or attending Adult Education classes.
- Q. What is the selection criteria to receive assistance?
- **A.** Qualifications to receive WIOA assistance depends on the following criteria:

If enrolled in an occupational credit program:

- · County of residence
- · Completion of at least one semester of college
- GPA of at least 2.0
- Desire and commitment to seek and obtain full-time employment
- · Type and level of program of study

If enrolled in Adult Education Services (i.e. GED®)

- Age 16–24
- Not enrolled in a middle or high school
- Not enrolled in other educational programs or schools
- Have the desire and commitment to participate in Adult Education training until next level completions and participate in work experience opportunities

- **Q.** What types of assistance does WIOA provide?
- A. WIOA can assist students with tuition, fees, textbooks, program supplies, uniforms, and tools.
 - * Additional support services are available based on individual eligibility and WIOA policy.
- Q. Do WIOA funds cover all CGTC programs of study?
- **A.** No. Only certain programs of study qualify for WIOA assistance. *See the WIOA program listing on the reverse side.

SPECIAL POPULATIONS

Special Populations Office

CGTC's Special Populations Office provides support services to students who are classified as "special populations." Available services include:

- Assistance with books purchases through the Lending Library (based on availability of funds)
- Assistance with program materials such as smocks, scrubs, tools, and more
- Assistance with classroom accommodations
- Career guidance and assessments
- Student resource guides and referral information
- Identification of resources to meet student needs
- Language translation services, free website translation
- Transportation assistance
- Childcare assistance



- **Single parents:** An individual who is not married and has custody of and is responsible for the care of one or more minor children, or an individual who is not married and is currently pregnant.
- Out-of-Workforce Individuals: Someone who has been out of the job market for a period of time and now needs to return to work for financial reasons due to separation, divorce, disability, or death of a spouse.
- Individuals who are Economically Disadvantaged: A credit-hour student who is a needs-based financial aid recipient of Pell or Temporary Aid to Needy Families (TANF); including low income youth and adults.
- **Individuals Preparing for Non-Traditional Fields:** A student enrolled in a program in which one gender makes up less than 25% of the total number of workers in that occupation (examples include, but are not limited to, a male student enrolled in the nursing program or a female student enrolled in the welding program).
- **English Learners:** A student whose first/native language is not English.
- **Individuals with Disabilities:** A student with a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning and working.
- **Homeless Individuals**
- Youth Populations: Youth who are in, or have aged out of, the foster care system or youth with parents on active duty in the armed forces.







Student Technology Guide

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To access student technology resources, go to **www.centralgatech.edu**, and click **Single Sign-On** at the top of the page. Once you log in to the Single Sign-On portal, you will be able to select the technology resource you wish to use without the need to sign in again. To use Single Sign-On, you must set up **Multi-Factor Authentication**. You will need your CGTC **student email address** and **password** to login:

New Students:

Once you're accepted to the college, you should receive an email to the personal email address you provided with your application. This email will include your student credentials and information on how to reset your password.

To reset your password (if you are a new student or have forgotten your password):

- 1. Click **Student Portal** on the CGTC homepage and click **Reset Password?** under the green login button.
- 2. Enter your information on the Password Reset form. (All fields are required and all information must be entered exactly as it appears in our records.)
- 3. Select the drop-down menu under Reset Password? Choose Yes, reset my password. And select Submit.
- 4. The system will generate a random password for you. It will be displayed in bold. Highlight and copy the password or write it down. Select CGTC Single Sign On page to return to the login screen and log in with your new password.

To change your password:

- 1. Click Single Sign On from the CGTC homepage.
- 2. In the top right corner of the page, select the arrow next to your name and choose Settings from the drop down menu.
- 3. Select Edit Profile, verify your current password, then fill out the Change Password box, then click Change Password.

Set up Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)

- 1. Click the Single Sign-On link at the top of the CGTC homepage
- Enter your college username (student email address) and password

- 4. Choose an option for MFA set up and follow the prompts

DISABILITY SERVICES

Disability Services provides equal access and educational opportunities for students with disabilities at Central Georgia Technical College.

What are considered disabilities?

Disabilities that affect learning and/or that necessitate a physical alteration will require medical or psychological documentation verifying criteria for:

- Learning Disabilities
- ADD/ADHD
- Brain Injuries
- Visual/Hearing/Health/Mobility Impairments
- Psychological Disorders

Accommodations are determined on an individual basis, based on documentation provided, and the interview with the student. Efforts will be made to remove any barriers, physical & cognitive, that might limit program accessibility.

Academic Accommodations

May include but are not limited to:

- Digital audio recorders
- ECHO pens
- Speech to text ECGO Assistive Technology
- Extended time
- Distraction-free environment
- Alternative format
- Books in electronic format
- Magnification software
- Computer equipment
- Sign Language interpreters
- Captioning



How do I sign up for disability services?

Students should contact the service provider and schedule an intake counseling session. Student will need to bring a copy of the current documentation of the disability.

Documentation includes but is not limited to:

- 1. Psychological evaluation
- 2. Letters from a physician or Vocational Rehabilitation counselor
- Current Individualized Education Program (IEP) from High School

Documentation must not be more than 3 years old.

The Special Populations Directors will determine all requests for reasonable accommodations. Decisions made regarding accommodations are based upon the current documentation and the program or course requirements.

Is my information kept confidential?

All information is confidential. The service provider is the only person allowed to know your disability, and all files are maintained in a locked cabinet.

DISABILITY SERVICES

Disability Services provides equal access and educational opportunities for students with disabilities at Central Georgia Technical College.

Documentation Requirements

Proper documentation helps the Special Populations Office navigate a qualified student's disability and determines eligibility for and defines appropriate accommodations. Documentation legitimizes a student's request for accommodations and, in general, includes the following:

The purpose of the documentation is twofold: to help the Special Populations Office determine if the student is a qualified individual with a disability and eligible for accommodations, and to determine appropriate accommodations. Documentation legitimizes a student's request for accommodations and, in general, includes the following:

- Identification of the nature and extent of the disability
- Specific information on the functional limitations as related to the academic environment
- Description of the current course of treatment, including medical side effects
- Prognosis for the disability
- Recommended reasonable accommodations

The documentation should be prepared by a professional and should be in the form of an assessment rather than a statement. The documentation should be dated within the last three years.

What services will not be provided?

- Personal devices such as hearing aids or glasses, and personal services such as assistance with eating, restroom, or dressing will not be provided.
- Accommodations that excessively lower or change classroom or program standards will not be provided. Example: Some instructors may allow alternative assignments or tests, these alternatives will not be easier or more difficult than the tests they are replacing.
- Accommodations that would change the essence of a program will not be provided. Example: A student with limited use of hands who is taking an air conditioning repair class. He or she may not ask to take a written test instead of physically repairing an air conditioning unit. The essence of the course is to physically repair the unit.

Americans With Disabilities Act Grievance Procedures

Students who have a complaint about accommodations provided by Central Georgia Technical College must attempt to resolve conflicts by contacting the Special Populations Office.

If the results of this process are unsatisfactory to the student, he or she must contact the Executive Director of Conduct, Appeals, and Compliance, who will investigate the complaint and make reasonable efforts to resolve the matter. The investigation shall be informal but thorough, affording all persons an opportunity to submit evidence or other relevant information.

If the complainant is not satisfied with the decision of the Executive Director of Conduct, Appeals, and Compliance, he/she can contact the Vice President of Student Affairs. The Vice President of Student Affairs shall provide a written or verbal final response to the student. Use of this grievance procedure does not limit a student's pursuit of other remedies, including the right to pursue a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Civil Rights.
