The Paralegal Studies Associate of Applied Science degree program requires in-person attendance (synchronous instruction) for the following courses: PARA 1105 Legal Research & Writing I, PARA 1110 Legal Research & Writing II, PARA1130 Civil Litigation, and PARA1140 Tort Law. Each course is a total of 3 credit hours. Synchronous delivery requires students to be in attendance online or in classrooms at specific dates/times during the term. All students must complete at least 9 credits of paralegal specialty coursework in synchronous format. Additional information is provided during program advisement.

Transfer credit will be considered for legal specialty courses that comply with the requirements of CGTC, the Technical College System of Georgia and the American Bar Association. CGTC does not award legal specialty credit by examination or portfolio. Students must complete a minimum of 25% of their legal specialty course requirements at Central Georgia Technical College in order to receive an award of the Associate of Applied Science Degree In Paralegal Studies.

Paralegals shall not engage in the unauthorized practice of law as per O.C.G.A. §15-19-51 and must work under the supervision of an attorney in good standing with the State Bar of Georgia.
