

# Steps to Enroll



## Follow these simple steps!



**Fill out the College application:** Apply online at <u>cgtc.io/apply</u>. Or, print and fill out a paper form. Applications can be turned in to your high school counselor or to the admissions office at the CGTC campus nearest you.

**Submit a transcript:** Students who have at least a **2.0 cumulative high school GPA** will be accepted to CGTC for the program of their choice. Some high schools may require a different GPA measure for certain courses. Check with your high school counselor for information. If you don't meet the GPA requirement, check with the CGTC high school coordinator to discuss other options for acceptance such as PSAT or Accuplacer score.

**Check your email for your acceptance letter!** Be sure to provide an accessible, personal email address in order to view your college acceptance letter. Your acceptance letter gives you important information such as your student ID number and credentials to use student resources.

**Apply for Dual Enrollment Funding:** Dual Enrollment courses are paid by state funding, but you MUST apply! Visit www.GAFutures.org to apply for funding each year. Students cannot register for college courses until the student applies for dual enrollment funding AND the parent approves participation in the dual enrollment program in GAFutures.

**Choose your courses:** Communicate with your CGTC high school coordinator and your high school counselor about the college courses you wish to take. The College will send you information about registering for your college classes via mail or your CGTC student email. All college registration must be completed through your CGTC High School coordinator with high school approval.



It's really that easy!

## You Should Also Know:

There is no application fee and CGTC waives all book costs and mandatory college fees for Dual Enrollment students. Certain programs do require course-related fees or purchase of personal protective equipment which are not covered by funding.



You can choose to take multiple courses per semester. Many courses are offered in 8 week terms or traditional semester length of 15 weeks. Dual enrollment funding will cover up to 15 credit hours per semester.



High school students are limited to 30 semester hours of dual enrollment funding. After 30 credit hours, students can choose to self pay for courses or, in some cases, utilize HOPE Grant/HOPE Career Grant\* funding for specific technical programs designated as high-demand careers in Georgia. \*Additional residency requirements and HOPE application required.



If you withdraw from two courses, you are no longer eligible for dual enrollment funding. You can still take college courses, but must use a different funding source to pay for classes.



**STAY IN TOUCH!** Make sure to stay in touch with your counselor and your CGTC High School coordinator. Communicate with your instructor to make sure you understand the material. If you need help, ask your instructor or contact the Academic Success Center for tutoring. If you need extra support, use the Student Self Alert button in your Single Sign On dashboard.

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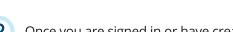

- 1. Go to www.gafutures.org
- 2. Click the Sign In button
- 3. Enter your Username and Password
- 4. Click the Sign In button

#### NO

- 1. Go to www.gafutures.org
- 2. Click the Create an Account button
- 3. Complete all information on the **Create new account?** screen
- 4. Click the Create Account button



- Once you are signed in or have created a new account, complete the application:
- 1. Click My Dual Enrollment Profile >> Apply Now >> Apply for Dual Enrollment
- 2. Click The Upcoming 2023-24 School Year.
- 3. Under **Student Demographic** section, review your pre-populated information and verify that your SS# and DOB are correct. Enter any missing info.
- 4. Under High School section:
  - · Click High School.
  - Select your high school name.
  - In the I Plan to Enroll statement, select May 2023 April 2024.
  - Select your appropriate grade level.
- 5. Under College Selection section, select Central Georgia Technical College.
- 6. Under **Participation Agreement** section:
  - Go to **Student Acknowledgment**, read and click on each box to indicate your agreement/understanding.
  - Read the HOPE Grant Implications box and click 'I Understand'.
  - For Student Signature, type your first and last name.
  - · Click Submit.
  - Write down the **Dual Enrollment Application ID** that appears.
    - \* The parent needs this so they can complete their part of the application!
- 7. The parent will then receive an email with information on how to log in and complete the parent portion of your application. They will use the **Dual**Enrollment Application ID and Student's Date of Birth to access the application.
- 8. If you are attending more than one college for DE:
  - Click My Dual Enrollment Profile.
  - · Click Add Colleges.
  - Select your second college.

**Note:** You must apply for and secure your Dual Enrollment funding in GAfutures **each year**. For help with your GAfutures application, please click the **Help** button on the GAfutures website or contact your high school initiatives coordinator.
