



Dual Enrollment Option B

Healthcare



High School Graduation Option B offers qualified students an alternate path to high school graduation. Students choose to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and a college Associate Degree, or a Technical Diploma, or two (2) Technical Certificates of Credit in a specific career pathway. The dual enrollment funding program cap of 30 credit hours applies.

Complete all required high school courses:

2 English: American Literature & Another

2 Math: Algebra 1 or Coordinate Algebra & Another

2 Science: Biology & Another

2 Social Studies: *beginning with freshman class

Additional Requirements:

Students enrolled in the Nurse Aide Technical Certificate of Credit may be required to successfully pass both criminal background checks and drug screening procedures to participate in required clinical experiences with patients in licensed facilities. Clinical sites will require proof of flu and CV-19 vaccination status to participate in required clinical experiences. Uniforms/scrubs will be required at required clinical experience facilities. Geriatric Care Assistant (GC51)

The Geriatric Care Assistant Technical Certificate provides the basic knowledge and skills needed to qualify employment as a nurse aide in nursing homes, elder personal care homes, and home healthcare agencies. The certificate emphasizes geriatric patient care, CPR, and first aid. Students successfully completing the certificate meet the academic requirements to take the exam that will allow them to be placed on the State Registry for nurse aides.

Phlebotomy Technician (PT21)

Teaches students to collect blood and process blood and body fluids. Phlebotomy technicians typically work in concert with clinical laboratory personnel and other healthcare providers in hospitals or other healthcare facilities. Topics covered include human anatomy, anatomical terminology, venipuncture, and clinical practice. Background checks and drug screens documentation must be completed prior to taking course PHLT 1030
