



# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CENTRAL GEORGIA TECHNICAL COLLEGE AND GEORGIA SOUTHWESTERN STATE UNIVERSITY

Georgia Southwestern State University (GSW) agrees to offer the Bachelor of Long Term Care Management (LTCM) via the internet and/or classroom settings to students of Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) who have completed appropriate degree courses that are required in the LTCM curriculum. Georgia Southwestern State University and Central Georgia Technical College enter into this agreement to assist in the transferability of credit hours and to allow graduates of Central Georgia Technical College the opportunity to remain in their communities while completing the Bachelor of Science in Long Term Care Management degree online or in classroom settings as desired and offered.

Georgia Southwestern State University agrees to offer LTCM courses to Central Georgia Technical College students who are interested in a career pathway in healthcare. Students who have successfully completed degree courses articulated in Appendix A of this agreement with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 will be able to start their major courses as outlined below.

#### Program/Curriculum Review

Each institution is responsible for the courses taught in its respective level of instruction. Many of the lower division general education courses are commonly numbered and described within the University System of Georgia. At least every five years, the Associate Dean of Health Sciences from Georgia Southwestern State University will meet with the Dean of Academic Affairs for Central Georgia Technical College to consider curriculum, recruitment, admission requirements and transfer of credits. They will also be in frequent contact to address any problems that may arise and to insure the continued success of the transfer of students into the LTCM program.

#### **Admissions**

Students must satisfy the admission requirements of Georgia Southwestern State University to enter the LTCM degree program. In order to smoothly transition between institutions and to maximize transfer credit, students should submit all required admission documents and designate "Long Term Care Management" as the desired field of study. Any student who might experience a transfer problem in this program should consult with the CGTC Registrar's Office, which will communicate with the appropriate officials at GSW to resolve the problem.

## **Program Coordination**

Central Georgia Technical College will assign (an) acceptable staff member(s) responsible for promoting the LTCM program on the CGTC campus, for advising students interested in the LTCM program, and for providing information to CGTC students, faculty and staff regarding procedures for admission into GSW's LTCM program.

#### Recruitment/Marketing

Central Georgia Technical College and Georgia Southwestern State University will jointly recruit for Long Term Care Management program to students interested in a career pathway in healthcare. GSW and CGTC will cooperate in the public release of information regarding the articulation agreement and in providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

#### **Tuition and Fees**

Students enrolled in Georgia Southwestern State University LTCM program from the programs at Central Georgia Technical College are considered Georgia Southwestern State University Students. GSW will receive all benefits associated with offering this program, including fees, tuition, and EFT credits.

Core GSW Area D will be satisfied with the two required lab science courses and an additional BIO, CHE, PHY, PSC course or MAT 1127. MAT 1127 is required in Area F so the student should take an additional science course as MAT 200 will be counted in Area F.

## Terms of the Agreement

Terms of this agreement will be effective upon signing by both institutions. Either party may terminate this agreement upon giving written notice to the other party. Such notice must be given one academic year in advance of the termination. In the event of termination, the responsibilities and obligations of the parties will include notifying all students who are enrolled in the LTCM courses. This agreement is herein entered into effective with the signatures and signature dates affixed on this document by the presidents of Central Georgia Technical College and Georgia Southwestern State University.
