

### Agreement with Central Georgia Technical College AS - Bachelor 2019 – 2024

#### Purpose

This agreement serves as an addendum to the current statewide articulation agreement between Mercer University and the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG). Under this agreement, Mercer University and Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) affirm that both entities will support the efficient and smooth transition of qualified students enrolled in eligible CGTC associate's degree programs.

Both parties agree to the following activities to support and strengthen the current partnership:

 Mercer University representatives will attend various CGTC's events (New Student Orientations, Open Houses, Career Fairs, etc.) to present the articulation agreement and highlight outcomes and opportunities associated with bachelor's degree achievement.

- Mercer University will host CGTC students annually on the Macon campus for an information session, tour, lunch, and classroom visits.
- Mercer and CGTC will develop a plan for early, onsite advisement sessions for those individuals interested in attending Mercer which will include notification of GACE Program Admission and Ethics Entry requirements for teacher candidacy.
- Mercer will develop advisement sheets for each eligible program included in the articulation agreement that clearly and accurately represent the transfer credit awarded by Mercer.
- Mercer and CGTC will highlight the value of the articulation agreement by developing a landing page on respective websites and marketing materials specific to this partnership.
- This agreement will be reviewed regularly by both parties to ensure continued ease of transfer for students interested in attending Mercer.
