Associate in Science in Nursing

The latest cohort of ASN Nursing graduates received a first attempt passing rate of 89.47% on the NCLEX licensure test, with 34 of 38 students successful.

Program Director Jessica Willcox was appointed to the Nursing Education Committee for the Board of Nursing. It is a two-year term to expire December 31, 2022.

Nurse Aide

The first group of Nurse Aide students from spring semester took their first registry tests since the beginning of the COVID pandemic. Instructors Amy Grimes, Ashley Hastings, Rabon Hewell, Alexis Hicks, Katheryn Ray worked, planned, cleaned, and prepared the lab for students to complete the lab component and to prepare the students for testing. The test is broken into two parts, written and skills, with passing scores required in order to be placed on the state registry. 5/6 students passed both sections, for a passing rate of 86%. The next testing date is August 4.

Air Conditioning Technology

Construction Education Foundation of Georgia (CEFGA), a statewide organization that promotes education in the construction trades, held its second annual awards ceremony recognizing teachers, students, and businesses in the state supporting the construction industry. Levi Johnson, a student in CGTC's dual enrollment AIRC program at Houston County Career Academy, received the student of the year award while the chair of CGTC's AIRC advisory committee, Bernie Joerger of Comfort Air, won for K-12 Pipeline Partner of the Year. In addition, local industries ACE Electric and MetroPower received awards related to support of apprenticeships with CGTC.

Admissions and Recruitment

- Enrollment for Fall Semester is ongoing
 - Full term and Session 1 begin Aug. 18; Session 2 begins October 13
- International students are now allowed to take more than one online course (Summer and Fall); this is temporary and may be revoked for Spring term. Traditionally, international students can take a maximum of one online course.

Financial Aid

- Student Financial Forms is fully functional now
 - o Students can now submit forms for verification electronically
 - Streamlines process and shortens approval times by providing online option for the verification process and eventually SAP appeals
- ECAR recertification was submitted by the June 30 deadline; status/approval of added programs and sites should be known by December 2020
- Working closely with Re-Entry Services to implement the Second Chance Pell program at three pilot sites for Fall semester

High School Initiatives

- Fall semester dual enrollment: 876Students currently registered
 - This number will grow exponentially over the next month as Career Academy cohorts and ECON students in Houston County are registered
 - ECON Pilot: All high schools in Houston County will offer ECON 1101 to eligible students at the high school
 - Teachers have been credentialed to offer college-level instruction
 - Rosters are still being finalized and these students will be registered in the coming weeks
 - Although this pilot was slowed slightly by the Pandemic, the DE team expects to registered close to 1,000 students for this pilot.
- New Dual Enrollment regulations effective summer 2020 have brought challenges
 - Students will be ineligible for dual enrollment funding:
 - As a 9th or 10th grader (10th grade is eligible for funding if in a technical program-Career Academy)
 - After reaching 30 DE paid hours
 - If withdrawn from more than one course (second w/d=ineligible)
 - Students who max out on hours can utilize the HOPE Grant for additional hours as long as they are enrolled in a HOPE Career Grant program

- For the first time, academic courses are being offered at the Houston County Career Academy for Fall semester 2020
 - Due the Pandemic, numbers are smaller than expected, but the College has a cohort of students from WRHS taking advantage of this opportunity.

Received approval for added Department of Corrections Sites – Baldwin State Prison, Emanuel Women's Facility, Eastman Youth Development Campus, and Macon Youth Development Campus.

Perkins Grant:

CGTC received approval of the FY2021-FY2024 Perkins Local Application and FY2021 Perkins Budget from TCSG on 06/30/2020. FY2021 funding allocation accepted is \$1,580,829.00.

Grants, Evaluation, and Student Support Services

- Submitted institutional applications for CARES Act funding
 - Student Funds (formula) –\$2,550,144 for direct student distribution
 - Institutional Funds (formula) -\$2,550,144 for transition to online learning
 - Minority Serving Institution (formula) \$335,644 for operations
- Veterans Business Outreach Center (VBOC) received funding from SBA in the amount of \$475,000 for Year 3 (2020-2021) for 3 full-time positions, supplies, and travel.
- The quarterly report (Jan-Mar) for the Commercial Motor Vehicle Operator Safety Training (CMVOST) grant was submitted on time, documenting eight military-affiliated students enrolled in grant-funded commercial truck driving courses and two graduated. Five additional students are registered for CTDL 1010 in the summer semester.
- The annual report for the Rural Utilities Service Distance Learning and Telemedicine (RUS DLT) grant was submitted on time, documenting installation of \$136,500 in grant-funded equipment and successful launch of telepresence STEM instruction to 75 dual-enrolled students at Jones County High School, as well as 22 students participating in tele-tutoring.
- Monthly reports for the TwoGen Innovation Grant (TGIG) funded by the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) have documented progress on the Macon campus playground visibility project with completion projected in June.
- RSI Grant Joseph Rossi is replacing Garrett Sisk as Program Chair. Academic Affairs has approved the addition of ENGT 2500 to the curriculum and implemented a partnership with Gilmer Warehouse and Logistics, to offer up to 6 paid Engineering Internships this summer (June 8 July 29) for up to 6 Engineering students. Information about the opportunity has been distributed to over 75 engineering students enrolled in AY2020.
- Susan Harwood Grant Economic Development is exploring how to offer the OSHA safety training via distance education while obtaining all required signatures from training participants.
- All students on Academic Suspension receiving a registration override for Summer semester will be automatically alerted for one-on-one contact and support through the TEAMS Outreach Center.
- TEAMS staff are identifying all students alerted during Spring (500+) who have not registered for Summer or Fall to contact and offer registration assistance.

- REACH Mentors are contacting participants to offer registration assistance for Summer or Fall. They are also collecting information from students unwilling to reenroll Summer to conduct future follow-ups and recruit REACH students back to CGTC in future terms for completion.
- TEAMS received \$1,000 grant award from Macon-Bibb CBDG to provide additional support to students residing in Bibb County.
- Adult Education Division is reviewing questions for a modified Student Opinion Survey to include some of the usual questions and some from the COVID-19 Campus Climate Survey.

Planning and Compliance

Institutional Effectiveness Operations:

- Coordinated the move of IE content from the old IE Portal tab to new pages under IE on the CGTC public website.
- Coordinating the migration of current intranet content to an archival site and considering options for new projects.

Planning and Assessment:

- The SLO Schedule for Summer Semester 2020 was shared with Program Chairs on 6/22/2020. This is a new tool for Program Chairs to utilize to verify SLO results have been collected from faculty. During Summer Semester 2020, 231 SLOs will be documented equating to roughly 3,200 individual student results.
- The IE Planning System organizational structure has been revised for FY2021 to reflect the revised CGTC organizational chart.
- All SLO Crosswalks and Timelines for occupational programs have been finalized and posted in the IE Planning System.
- Final plans are being developed to provide training and assistance in closing-out FY/AY 2020 operational assessment plans students learning outcomes and plan for FY/AY 2021 operational assessment plans and student learning outcomes. Additional information to come.

Perkins Grant Project Compliance:

- Plans to electronically document the implementation of the FY2020 Perkins Transition Plan and FY2021 Perkins Local Application are currently under development.
- The Perkins Equipment Process was revised effective 07/01/2020. The revised Perkins Equipment Process was shared with internal stakeholders and will be shared with Program Chairs, Department Heads, and Service Units when they are notified of the approval to expend Perkins funds approved and allocated for equipment. Compliance with the revised Perkins Equipment Process will ensure CGTC is positioned for continued success during TCSG Internal Control Reviews. The revised Perkins Equipment Process is available on iNet under IE Perkins.

Programmatic Accreditation:

- The Physical Therapy Assistant program successfully held the CAPTE virtual onsite visit for initial accreditation on June 21-24, 2020. The visit report was received on July 9, 2020. The PTA program has until August 8, 2020, to respond to the visit report. The report of the visiting team and CGTC's comments and additional materials will be reviewed at CAPTE's Fall meeting, October-November 2020.
- The Cardiovascular Technology program is currently waiting to receive additional information from JRC-CVT regarding a virtual site visit. The original visit, scheduled for May 29, 2020, was postponed due to COVID-19. JRC-CVT does not anticipate any virtual site visits to be conducted before early to mid-fall.
