#### INFORMATION ITEMS

<u>CGTC Mission</u> The College's mission statement is made available to the public on the CGTC public website, strategic plan, and online college catalog. The mission stands as written below:

Central Georgia Technical College, a unit of the Technical College System of Georgia, offers credit instruction, adult education, and customized business and industry training through traditional and distance education delivery designed to promote community and workforce development (2019-2023).

<u>IPEDS</u> – Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System is a system of interrelated surveys conducted annually by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). Data is collected from all colleges and universities that participate in Title IV federal student financial aid programs. The Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended, requires that institutions that participate in federal student aid programs report data on enrollments, admissions, program completions, graduation rates and outcome measures, faculty and staff, finances, institutional costs, student financial aid, and academic libraries. These data are collected per NCES data formulas that generally calculate data differently than our TCSG data system; meaning the data in KMS is more accurate than most data sets in IPEDS because of the calculations used and the cohorts included or excluded from each data set.

Each year the IE Division has a completion goal for the Institution to meet the scheduled dates for all survey components. The Fall Survey components for CGTC were locked two weeks prior to the due date of October 16, 2019.

#### **Grants**

**Perkins V** – The Technical College System of Georgia is in the process of completing a new Carl D. Perkins State Plan. Several internal and external stakeholder meetings have been held to gather information to complete a comprehensive needs assessment and plan. A public hearing was broadcasted to 14 sites across the state where the public were invited to attend. CGTC's Warner Robins campus was one of the sites. The State Plan is scheduled to be submitted to the Governor in January 2020. TCSG Colleges (CGTC) will submit a Comprehensive Needs Assessment pulled together based on local stakeholder input by February 6, 2020 and a Local Application on or before April 7, 2020. TCSG will disburse an estimated \$18 mill and CGTC is expecting to receive around \$1.3 mill for the 2021 fiscal year budget.

#### **CMVOST (Commercial Motor Vehicle Operator Safety Training) Grant**

Dept. of Transportation

- Received notification of award for Sept 2019- Sept 2020 \$136,738
- Provides funding for tuition and fees to support military-affiliated students enrolled in the Commercial Truck Driving program

## **Susan Harwood Capacity Building Grant**

## Dept. of Labor

- Received notification of funding for 2019-2020 (Year 2 of the performance period) \$163,781
- During Year 1, an average 14 percentage point increase was documented in the performance of OSHA health and safety training attendees on OSHA approved assessments
  - o Pre-Training Assessment Score Average: 75
  - o Post-Training Assessment Score Average: 89
  - 90 Day Post-Training Follow-up Assessment Score Average: 87

#### American Apprenticeship Initiative (AAI) Grant

TCSG/ Dept. of Labor

- Received notification of funding through TCSG for 2019-2020 \$100,000
- Funding will support expansion of DOL Registered Apprenticeship agreements with employers, as well as student apprentice tuition, fees, books and supplies

#### Two Generation Innovation Grant (TGIG)

#### **GA DECAL**

- Piloting evening childcare for Pell-eligible student-parents during Fall and Spring Semesters with activities supporting family engagement
- Project leadership participated in interview with the Center for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL) for upcoming national publication on successful initiatives supporting student-parents and their children
- Project Director participated in a panel presentation at the Cobb Collaborative and presented at the 2019 State of the Public's Health Conference

#### **Student Success**

#### **TEAMS Outreach Center**

Utilization of the early alert system is increasing

- Over 430 alerts to date in Fall Semester 2019, a 128% increase over 188 alerts in Fall 2018
- 30 students have self-alerted to date in Fall Semester 2019, a 200% increase over 10 self-alerts in Fall 2018

## R.E.ACH (Raising Expectations of Achievement) Student Organization

- A total of 108 students (duplicated) participated in the first three sessions of the semester
- 25 students participated in the Meal Etiquette session
- The R.E.ACH Student Organization participated in the Fall Festival events on all three campuses
