Academic Affairs

Sonia Wynne (Hemodialysis), CGTC's Instructor of the Year, was named a top 9 finalist for the TCSG Rick Perkins Award for Excellence in Technical Education. Ms. Wynne was recognized as one of three central regional finalists to advance to the final round of interviews during the 2022 GOAL and Rick Perkins celebration in Atlanta on April 25-27. She will continue to serve as CGTC's ambassador for technical education for the year.

Computer Information Systems

CGTC instructor Felicia Everidge received the CISCO Instructor Excellence Award for 2021. This award recognizes a CCSI (Certified Cisco Systems Instructor) who provides the highest quality training experience and who demonstrates the best overall instructor performance as measured by the customer satisfaction survey globally. The award emphasizes the instructors' extensive practical experience and expertise in Cisco's technologies and their ability to pass on this knowledge.

Nursing

CGTC signed a new agreement with the University of Phoenix that provides a cost-effective, accelerated pathway for associate degree nursing (ASN) students to begin their bachelor's degree.

CGTC's current RN-BSN bridge agreement with the University of Phoenix allows students who have graduated from Central Georgia Technical College with their Associate Degree in Nursing and earned their nursing license to transfer up to 87 credits toward the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). Under the new agreement, ASN students can concurrently enroll in the University of Phoenix BSN program to begin and complete the four-year degree on an accelerated timeline. The University of Phoenix will also waive the tuition of every sixth course for all Central Georgia Technical College students who enroll in the RN to BSN degree program. This agreement is strategically timed to the fall opening of student housing, making it possible for CGTC students to complete a four-year degree with a partner institution while still living on campus.

Radiologic Technology

Students are completing their Spring community service project by donating hygiene bags and non-perishable items to Fishers and Loaves ministry.

All 10 of the graduating seniors from the Warner Robins campus have received employment offers in field.

Houston Healthcare donated Mobile X-ray Units to the Warner Robins and Macon campuses.

Physical Therapist Assistant

The PTA program hosted the second annual evidence-based student platform presentation symposium on May 2. This event was open to the CGTC faculty, staff, and clinical partners.

Paramedicine

Paramedicine program faculty taught over 50 personnel in law enforcement, fire and nursing in tactical emergency casualty care on March 24-25. Agencies represented in the training included Houston County Sheriff's office, Houston County Fire department, Warner Robins Police department, Warner Robins Fire department, Trinity school of Medicine and CGTC ASN program. The skills learned were utilized and reinforced in the active shooter drill conducted on the Warner Robins campus on March 26, 2022.
