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#### NEW PROGRAM REQUEST

##### AI-ENHANCED ROBOTIC MANUFACTURING SPECIALIST

Technical Certificate of Credit  
(institutionally-developed)

**Proposed Date of Implementation:** Fall Semester 202412

**Location:** GA Veterans Education Career Transition Resource (VECTR) Center

**Program Description:** The AI-Enhanced Robotic Manufacturing Specialist certificate program allows students to enhance their automated manufacturing skills by learning basic robotic concepts, fundamentals of cyber-physical systems, basics of artificial intelligence in the manufacturing environment, principles of programmable logic controllers, and basics in machine vision technology.

**Statement of Need for Program in the Service Area:** This program will help establish a workforce pipeline for critical AI manufacturing sectors in Middle Georgia and across the state. TCSG colleges have numerous manufacturing programs but do not currently have programs that will train individuals specifically for AI manufacturing. Furthermore, GA is home to almost 700,000 veterans and their families. This program at the GA Veterans Education Career Transition Resource (VECTR) Center will train returning service members and their families in AI manufacturing and robotics. Graduates will utilize this training to support the booming aerospace, defense, and precision manufacturing sectors in Middle GA

### PHLEBOTOMY TECHNOLOGY SPECIALIST TCC (PT71)

Technical Certificate of Credit

**Proposed Date of Implementation: Summer Semester 202316**

**Location:** Dual enrollment location at William S. Hutchings College & Career Academy

**Statement of Need for Program in the Service Area:** Hutchings College and Career Academy administration, along with local healthcare partner groups, requested this program. This TCC is on the Hope Career Grant list.

**Program Description:** The Phlebotomy Technician program educates students to collect blood and process blood and body fluids. Phlebotomy technicians typically work in concert with clinical laboratory personnel and other healthcare providers in hospitals or other healthcare facilities. Topics covered include human anatomy, anatomical terminology, venipuncture, and clinical practice.

### NURSE AIDE (CN21)

Technical Certificate of Credit

**Proposed Date of Implementation: Fall Semester 202412**

**Location:** Putnam County Center

**Statement of Need for Program in the Service Area:** Local home health care companies are interested in hiring CNAs in the local area.

**Program Description:** Prepares students with classroom training and practice as well as the clinical experiences necessary to care for patients in various settings including general medical and surgical hospitals, nursing care facilities, community care facilities for the elderly, and home health care services. Students who successfully complete this program may be eligible to sit for the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program (NNAAP), which determines competency to become enrolled in the state Nurse Aide Registry. Students enrolled in this program will be required to successfully pass both criminal background checks and drug screening procedures to participate in required clinical experiences with patients in licensed facilities. Clinical sites will require liability insurance and proof of immunization status to participate in required clinical experiences. Uniforms/scrubs will be required at required clinical experience facilities. All costs for these items are the responsibility of the student and not CGTC. Specific details will be provided during class orientation to NAST 1100.

### ***Academic Affairs***

Scott Selph CGTC's Rick Perkins Award Winner (Instructor of the Year) competed in the regional competition on Tuesday, March 7, on the Warner Robins campus. Finalists will be announced at the statewide event next month to secure an interview for the TCSG Instructor of the Year honor.

Amy Holloway and Andrea Griner attended the TCSG standardization summit in Savannah on Feb 9-10. The purpose of the summit was to explore standardizing economic development training within the technical system that aligns with credit instruction to create accelerated training for high-demand industry pathways. CGTC will create a pathway pilot for industry ready training in manufacturing and/or logistics.

### ***Aerospace, Trade & Industry***

CGTC hosted over 150 high school teachers from across the state for the annual Trade & Industrial Educators of Georgia (TIEGA) Winter Conference. The conference included networking interactive workshops related to Career and Technical Education (CTAE) teachers.

CGTC's first two automatic truck cohorts on the Macon campus have had a 100% CTDL licensure pass rate.

### ***Engineering***

Jaiden Purvis, a Houston County Career Academy dual enrollment Engineering student, recently secured an internship with Total Engineering out of Macon, where she is conducting design work for the firm.

### ***Biotechnology***

CGTC's Biotechnology Program hosted the Rural Teaching Training Initiative workshop for 28 high school teachers from Middle and South Georgia on the Warner Robins campus. Sponsored by the Center for Global Health Innovation in Atlanta, the event included lectures and guided laboratory experiments relevant to the biotechnology field from the CEO of Micron Biomedical and a CDC representative, respectively.

### ***Radiology Technology***

Macon RADT program students are actively fundraising to attend a student educational seminar in Orlando in October. They are selling Butterbraid danishes, ground coffees & teas, and radiology-themed keychains that are locally made by a former program graduate. Anyone wishing to purchase items may contact the program chair Amanda Cobb directly. Delivery of items will be on 3/29.

### ***Early Childhood Care and Education***

Christel Nelson, an adjunct ECCE instructor, was one of 13 citizens honored in the Eatonton Black History Program for her work in the community.

### ***Welding***

Aaron Clark, chair of the welding program, led the statewide faculty consortium meeting on February 22 on the Macon campus.

Once approved, the PLANAR will be shared with all stakeholders participating in the planning process. The Plan will guide the development of the FY2024 and FY2025 Perkins budgets by identifying occupational programs and support services eligible for support under the Plan.

### **Student Success**

#### **TEAMS Outreach Center**

The TEAMS Outreach Center (TOC) staff have noted that alerted students have limited awareness of College resources that support success. The TOC staff is expanding efforts to get this information to students before they need it.

- At the beginning of Spring semester, the TOC staff emailed success strategies to 1,248 students alerted in previous terms who reenrolled.
- Beginning Summer semester, the TOC staff will mail postcards with resource information to all new CGTC students
- TOC staff met with students at the ASN program orientation and three resource fairs.
- Staff also plan to conduct class visits and participate in the upcoming three Spring Fling and two Career Fair events this semester.
- The Student Navigator is identifying trends and sharing data with specific programs to inform future processes (i.e. encouraging Health programs to updated program expense sheets with projected due dates)
- TOC staff are resuming class visits to attempt contact with alerted students who do not respond to emails, phone calls, or postcard communication.

As the semester approaches the 50% point, the early alert submission count is already 58% of the total alerts from Spring 2022. The pace of alert submissions indicates the total number of alerts for Spring semester is projected to exceed the count for the same period last year.
