Network Upgrades

Core network equipment upgrades have been completed at the following locations:

A new firewall has been configured in Macon to provide redundancy and allow in-place upgrades with no Internet downtime. Security rules (Access Control Lists) and network segments have also been standardized across the locations with new hardware. Equipment to perform the same upgrade at the VECTR center is being planned, and a requisition has been sent to TCSG for the equipment purchase.

Cyber Security Update

Cyber security software, CrowdStrike, has been installed on over 1,000 college-owned employee computers and servers. CrowdStrike provides monitoring for and protection from malicious software and can be used as a forensic tool if there is a computer/network-related event. TCSG is negotiating additional licenses to install the software on all college-owned computers providing the same level of protection to computers used by students.

Student Learning Outcomes

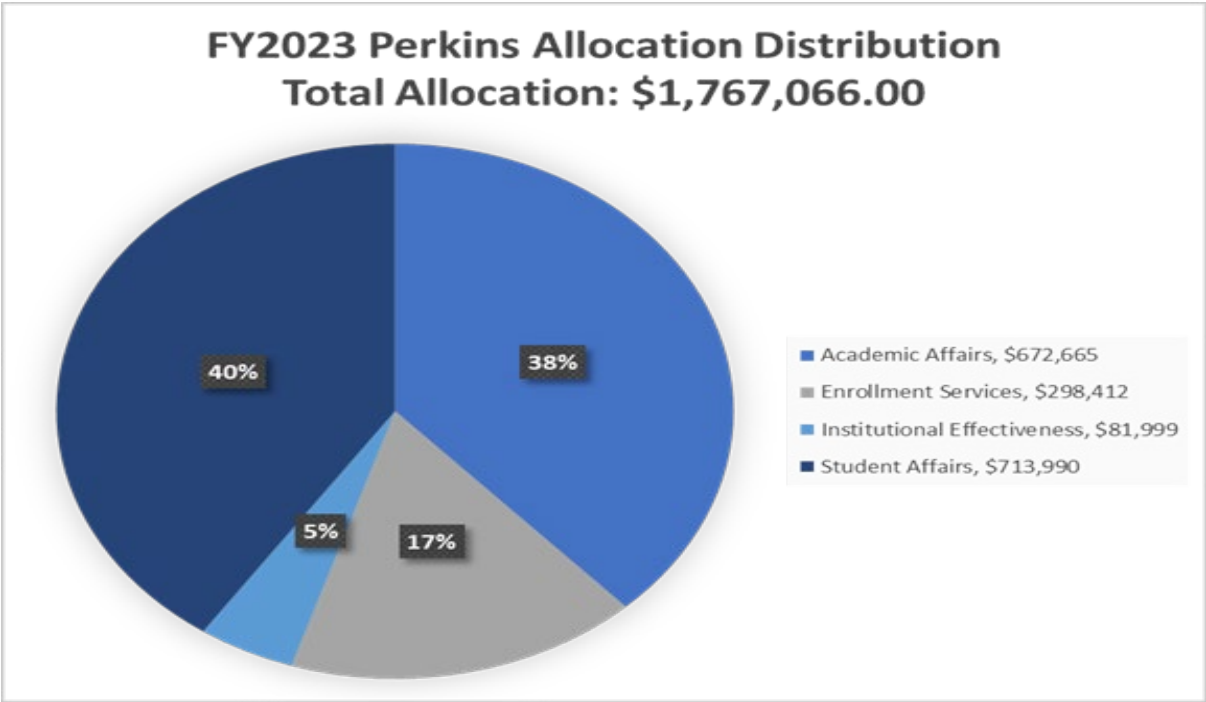

State Pass-Through Grant

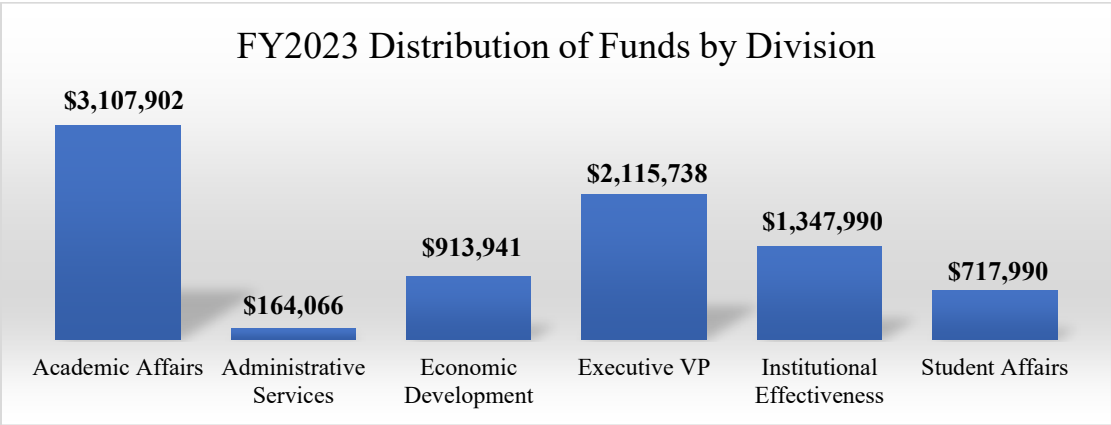
Carl D. Perkins Act Funding – CGTC will received an annual allotment of \$1,720,463.00 to fund FY2024 Perkins eligible activities upon approval of the College's local plan. The current FY 2023 allocation of

\$1,767,066 is being distributed among various Divisions to provide funding in support of instruction and student supports as indicated in the table below.



Grants

The Institutional Effectiveness Division pursues funding to support all divisions of the College. Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, and the Executive Vice President (VECTR) Divisions are receiving over \$6M from grants and competitive funding sources to provide quality programming and services and improve student learning and success.

Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce grant **\$600,000**

Funds will be used to support the Nursing Bridge Expansion Project in Macon. Grant funds will be used to purchase simulation equipment and supplies, instructional technology, and provide stipends to new and existing full-time LPN/ASN faculty.

Grant Applications in Progress

IDEAS (Increase and Diversity Education Abroad for US Students) Grant Program [US Dept of State] \$35,000 to expand experiential learning opportunities abroad targeting minority and first-generation students in technical programs.

- Received notification that CGTC's proposal was selected as a semi-finalist. A full proposal will be submitted in April 2023.

Veterans Business Outreach Center (VBOC) program [US Small Business Association] \$500,000 to provide entrepreneurial training and assistance to transitioning military and veterans throughout Georgia.

- After successful completion of a five-year VBOC program, CGTC was invited to submit for funding to continue the program for another five-year cycle. Funding is awarded for the first year with four continuation years. A full application will be submitted in April 2023.

Lowe's Foundation Gable Grants program seeks to address employment challenges in the skilled trades workforce. They are funding projects to increase enrollment and completion of women and under-represented groups in targeted programs. Grant awards are needs-based and will range between \$100,000 and \$1,000,000 for a 24 month period.

- An application on behalf of the CGTC Foundation is under development and will be submitted in April 2023.

The TEAMS Outreach Center coordinates personalized outreach and wrap around support services to students facing academic barriers or personal hardships.
