Statement of Need for Program in the Service Area: Nurse Aides are a critical part of the healthcare delivery system. As the demand for quality healthcare services continues to rise and the healthcare landscape evolves, it is crucial that we provide a fast track to adapt and equip our students with the skills and knowledge required to meet the industry's changing demands. The healthcare sector is currently facing numerous challenges, including a shortage of qualified professionals. This shortage not only hampers the delivery of timely and effective healthcare services but also creates a significant strain on the existing healthcare workforce. By introducing an accelerated nurse aide program, we can contribute to bridging this gap and play a vital role in addressing the workforce shortage with an accelerated approach.

Program Description: The Nurse Aide Accelerated Technical Certificate of Credit prepares students with classroom training and practice as well as the clinical experiences necessary to care for patients in various settings including nursing care facilities, general medical and surgical hospitals, community care facilities for the elderly, and home health care services. After the completion of the state approved training program, the candidate must take and pass the competency evaluation examination. The examination includes a written/oral and skills competency examination administered by an approved testing agency. Candidates who successfully pass the written/oral and skills competency examination are included on the Georgia Nurse Aide Registry.

Statement of Need for Program in the Service Area: Local home health care companies are interested in hiring CNAs in the local area.

Program Description: Prepares students with classroom training and practice as well as the clinical experiences necessary to care for patients in various settings including general medical and surgical hospitals, nursing care facilities, community care facilities for the elderly, and home health care services. Students who successfully complete this program may be eligible to sit for the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program (NNAAP), which determines competency to become enrolled in the state Nurse Aide Registry.
