ACCELERATED PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN (AP81)

Technical Certificate of Credit

Proposed Date of Implementation: Spring Semester 202414

Location: Warner Robins Campus

Statement of Need for Program in the Service Area: Employment of phlebotomists is projected to grow 8 percent from 2022 to 2032, faster than the average for all occupations. About 19,500 openings for phlebotomists are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire. The growing population, with its rising share of older people, will continue to increase demand for medical services, including blood testing. Blood analysis remains an essential part of medical care, as it is used to check for a wide range of issues. Therefore, demand for phlebotomists will remain high as doctors and other healthcare professionals require bloodwork for analysis and diagnosis.

Program Description: The Phlebotomy Technician program educates students to collect blood and process blood and body fluids. Phlebotomy technicians typically work in concert with clinical laboratory personnel and other healthcare providers in hospitals or other healthcare facilities. This accelerated program would offer a condensed curriculum that covers the fundamental knowledge and techniques of phlebotomy, infection control, and venipuncture procedures. It would also provide hands-on training through clinical rotations and simulations, allowing students to gain practical experience and develop confidence in their abilities.

- Initiative launched in October 2023 to encourage Georgia students to attend college by offering automatic acceptance for qualified students to TCSG and USG institutions.
