The Dental Hygiene program is excited about the 100% pass rate for students taking the CREDTS (Central Regional Dental Testing Services) exam on their first attempt (23/23) and 100% pass rate for students taking the ADEX (American Board of Dental Examiners) exam on their first attempt (3/3).

American Society of Radiology Technology Leadership Conference

Amanda Cobb was invited to attend the American Society of Radiology Technology Leadership Conference in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

University of Georgia School of Medicine Interview Committee

Dr. Patricia Wynne was invited to be on the UGA School of Medicine committee where she interviewed 32 students who are in the process of being selected for UGA's inaugural cohort. There were over 230 applicants and between 60 to 80 students will be chosen.

Apprenticeship Update

- Unified Defense's Registered apprenticeship has been approved:
 - 10 apprentices from CGTC WELD program were interviewed and hired in January
 - 9 more were hired after a second round of interviews in April
 - A third round of apprentice interviews/vetting is scheduled for May 27 to select an additional 10 apprentices
- Speir and Associates (Electrical Contractor) apprenticeship has been approved
 - Mr. Pace and team are working with Jones County College & Career Academy to establish a Pre-Apprenticeship program to feed into the apprenticeship program
- A new apprentice was added to Northrop Grumman's RAP last week
- We recently received approval for a RAP at Graphic Packaging's Macon Mill
 - Initially, 6 apprentices have been added to the RAP
 - The Related Technical Instruction for this program will be delivered by Economic Development
 - This will allow for a significant spend-down of remaining AER Grant funds in Q4
- Working with Blue Bird to develop a RAP

PEP – Prison Education Program

The College underwent a substantive change on-site review on March 23 – 25, 2026 to gain approval to offer the Prison Education Program (PEP) at two prisons, Walker State and Dooly State. Approvals provide the opportunity for the College to offer Pell to incarcerated individuals. A committee of peers from neighboring States reviewed our PEP Compliance Report documents for the two sites and unanimously agreed with our compliance statement on all standards. There were no recommendations and the Committee will submit both reports to the SACSCOC Board of Trustees for final decision in June. The College has now undergone all the steps necessary to gain its first two PEP sites. In accordance with Federal and accreditation requirements, we can now offer Pell at additional PEP sites without undergoing the extensive process for approval; however, other substantive change actions may apply to new locations.

In Fall 2025, WorkSource Middle Georgia was awarded a \$250,000 Top State for Talent Grant to build pre-apprenticeship/apprenticeships pipelines for manufacturing, healthcare and education in and create career pathways with sustainable wages & long-term regional impact serving 100 apprentices by June 30, 2027. CGTC WIOA Career Advisors will provide outreach and case management for apprentices in the Local Workforce Delivery Area (LWDA) 11 attending CGTC. Registered apprentices will be coded as an apprentice and tracked in the WorkSource Georgia Portal.

REACH (Raising Expectations of Achievement)

REACH is a student organization supporting student retention. The organization provides mentors who work one-one one with students and in group sessions sharing information on topics of interest and topics which support self-sufficiency.

During the Spring 2026 semester, REACH saw significant student participation, with 23 unduplicated male students engaging in program activities or receiving direct services. This involvement spanned session attendance, mentoring, community service, and personalized academic or personal support, reflecting the program’s ongoing impact on student connection, belonging, and success.



Additionally, REACH experienced substantial digital engagement growth when comparing Spring 2025 to Spring 2026. Data from QR-tracked webpages showed a notable rise in traffic across all platforms, including a 22% increase for the REACH website, 17% for the session page, 13% for the M&G page, and a 23% jump for the podcast page. Most significantly, engagement with the interest form and assessment survey spiked by 48% and 46%, respectively, highlighting a strong upward trend in student interest and feedback. These metrics underscore a growing momentum that positions REACH to expand its outreach and deepen its influence on student outcomes in the coming semesters.

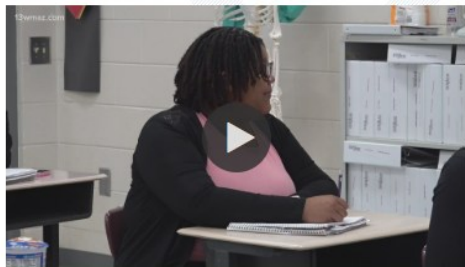

WARNER ROBINS, Ga. (WGXA) — Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) is set to transform healthcare education in the region with a more than \$100 million investment aimed at preparing thousands of students for high-demand medical careers.

- On April 16, 2026, Dr. Mark Scott served as the keynote speaker at the Georgia College and Career Academy Network and Dual Enrollment Summit. He emphasized how the future expansion of healthcare programs for high school students will strengthen Georgia’s workforce pipeline and help address the statewide shortage of healthcare professionals. He also highlighted how local school districts and Central Georgia Technical College have developed pathways designed to meet the evolving needs of the healthcare industry.
- Houston County School District launched a dedicated website for the Houston STEM and Career Academy to provide parents and prospective students with program details, job outlooks, salary information, course-sequence mapping, and an anticipated graduation timeline.
- On April 27, 2026, a meeting was held with W.S. Hutchings College and Career Academy. In attendance were Dr. Mark Scott, Dr. Cassandra Washington (CTAE Director and CEO of W.S. Hutchings College and Career Academy),

and academy staff. The purpose of the meeting was to plan for future program expansion and to discuss opportunities related to student grants.

- On May 1, 2026, a groundbreaking ceremony was held for the Houston County STEM and Career Academy, marking a pivotal milestone in the project's development. This event formally launched the construction phase and confirmed that the Academy remains on schedule for its planned Fall 2027 opening.
