The CGTC Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) program recently hosted a successful reaffirmation site visit by onsite reviewers from the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE). The College and program were very pleased with the reviewers' comments and observations, which reflected positively on the quality and effectiveness of the PTA program, with most recent outcomes of 100% graduation rate, 96% national board exam pass rate (average over two years), and 100% employment rate.

The recent site visit marks an important milestone in the program's continued growth and success. In Spring 2026, the CAPTE Board of Commissioners will make a formal determination regarding the program's continued accreditation status. The college and program are optimistic and hopeful for a favorable outcome, including a clean visit report and a ten-year accreditation renewal.

CGTC Scheduled to Sign Four Articulation Agreement with Middle Georgia State University

The signing ceremony between Middle Georgia State University (MGA) and Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) is scheduled for Thursday, October 2nd at 2:00 PM. The four agreements, A.S. in Education, A.S. in Social Work, A.S. in Psychology, and A.S. in Criminal Justice, will provide students with greater ease of transfer to senior institutions. Graduates from these programs will go on to meet the workforce needs in crucial high-demand areas in Middle Georgia.

General Education Conference to be Held at CGTC

CGTC will host the General Education Conference in November on the Macon Campus. TCSG accepted proposals from the following CGTC faculty: Dr. William Perez-Martinez will give a presentation titled Technology-Enhanced Teaching for Student Success: Leveraging NotebookLM and Open Educational Resources (OER) and Christina Swann, Dr. Ekaterina Mirzakulova, and Tammie Henderson will give a presentation titled From the Garden to the Classroom.

CGTC AEMT Student Participation

Our Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (AEMT) students assisted with first aid coverage for the Ocmulgee Indigenous People Celebration and represented GCTC and the program with great success. These students also supported the single officer active shooter response (SOAR) training at the Georgia Public Training center participating as victims and perpetrators.

Academic Success Centers Continue to Assist Students in Innovative Ways

The Academic Success Center's total number of tutoring sessions grew by 30.7% from AY24 to AY25. This growth included the newly added Al Tutor, as well as in-person tutoring. Over the academic year, the Academic Success Centers served 15% of CGTC's students. In AY25, students using the Al Tutor had an 86% pass rate compared to an 82% pass rate for the college as a whole. If you look at 100% online students, those using Al Tutor had an 83% pass rate compared to the 75% overall pass rate for 100% online students at the college. As of September 9th, 67% of students ASC served in Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 registered for summer or fall 2025 classes (this number does not include students who graduated).

CGTC Cybersecurity Club Student Winner Recognized

Kaleb Brown, CGTC's National SkillsUSA Champion in the Computer Programming category and 1st Place winner at SkillsUSA Nationals, will be formally recognized at the Warner Robins Chamber of Commerce meeting on Monday, 21 October at 5:00 p.m. This is an exciting opportunity to showcase not only Kaleb's outstanding achievement on the national stage but also the strength and dedication of our students and programs. Several club members and faculty will be attending the event to support Kaleb. This recognition reflects the hard work and commitment of our students, instructors, and community partners, and we look forward to celebrating Kaleb's success at this important community event.

CGTC Continues to Issue Digital Badges

AED Success Story: HiSET Fast Track Program Pilot



Central Georgia Technical College's Adult Education Program successfully launched its inaugural HiSET Fast Track Program Pilot on August 28 thru 30, 2025. This innovative initiative aimed to accelerate preparation for the High School Equivalency Test (HiSET) for adult learners in the region. Out of 41 applicants, 14 met the preliminary testing requirements to participate in the fast-track program.

11 determined students actively engaged in the intensive program, which was designed to equip them with the skills and knowledge needed to pass the HiSET exam effectively. 8 students successfully graduated on the first attempt, resulting in a significant achievement in their educational journeys. The number increased to 9 on the second attempt.

For those students who did not meet the initial testing criteria, the program ensured that they were not left behind. Instead, they enrolled in classes, allowing them to continue their education and work towards meeting their goal. This approach underscores the program's commitment to supporting all learners in their pursuit of educational and career aspirations.

Strategic Initiatives had a successful site visit to Hawthorne Academy School of Health Sciences in Charlotte, NC on September 11, 2025. The attendees of this trip included Dr. Ivan Allen (Central Georgia Technical College), Dr. Mark Scott (Central Georgia Technical College), Dr. Kristina Brooks (Baldwin County Schools, Superintendent), Ms. Cynthia Busbee (Atrium Health Navicent, Chief of Staff) and Mr. Derick Austin (Putnam County Schools, Superintendent). The group toured Hawthorne Academy, where they had the opportunity to ask questions about the curriculum and the development of the Bloomberg Philanthropies project on campus. The visit provided valuable insight into the collaborations required among local school districts, colleges, and healthcare partners to ensure the project's success and positive outcomes for students. Information was shared regarding potential challenges that may arise during the project and about the current curriculum being offered.

Hawthorne Academy currently has four pathways: Nursing, Radiology, Neurodiagnostic, and Healthcare Simulation. The school is in the process of transitioning from the Global Military curriculum to Healthcare Academy curriculum and is actively working through the challenges associated with that shift. Superintendents were able to observe how the program could be implemented. Additional details were shared about the school's current enrollment and how those numbers may change as students' progress through the program.



On September 22, 2025, an informative dual enrollment meeting was held by the Houston County School District.

Attendees included Dr. Mark Scott, Dr. Tatrabian Jackson, and Ms. Kimberly Gunn from Central Georgia Technical

College. Representing the Houston County School District were Ms. Amada Coker, Counselor and Ms. Monica Smith,

Counselor. The meeting focused on program and pathway options available to students in the Allied Health Academy, as
well as how these offerings would be integrated into high school schedules.

On September 29, 2025, a strategic meeting was held with the Academic Affairs team to advance planning for the Allied Health Academy. The session brought together key educational leaders, including Dr. Mark Scott, Dr. Tatrabian Jackson, Ms. Deann Nester, and Dr. Patricia Wynne. The group engaged in a collaborative discussion focused on curriculum development, programming, course scheduling and implementation. Ideas were shared on how these academic components would be effectively integrated into the daily schedules of high school students participating in the Allied Health Academy. The meeting reflected a shared commitment to delivering rigorous, career-focused education that aligns with student core curriculum needs.

On October 1, 2025, Dr. Mark Scott served as the featured speaker at the Perry Area Chamber of Commerce's Business at Breakfast event. During his presentation, Dr. Scott introduced the STEM/Allied Health High School Initiative, highlighting its mission to prepare students for careers in the health care workforce. He shared details about strategic partnerships with local hospitals and school districts, emphasizing collaborative efforts to strengthen the healthcare workforce across Central Georgia.

Strategic Initiatives has confirmed an upcoming site visit to the Northwell School of Health Sciences in New York, it is scheduled for November 6, 2025. The visit aims to strengthen relationships with other Bloomberg Philanthropies grant recipients and gather valuable perspectives and experience in the development of their healthcare academy.

Strategic Initiatives has confirmed an upcoming site visit to the Nurses Middle College in Nashville, Tennessee, scheduled for December 5, 2025. The visit will include representatives from Central Georgia Technical College's Facilities division, Academic Affairs division and local school district superintendents. Attendees will have the opportunity to observe firsthand the implementation of programs similar to the healthcare academy currently in development.
