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Executive Summary

End of Year Report AY2022

Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) is a two-year public college and unit of the Technical College System of Georgia. CGTC is continuously proving its value to the State of Georgia as it provides educational resources for citizens residing in or near its eleven-county service area of Bibb, Baldwin, Crawford, Dooly, Houston, Jones, Monroe, Peach, Pulaski, Putnam and Twiggs counties, resulting in a skilled workforce that strengthens Georgia's economic climate. The College operates and maintains over one million square feet of existing facilities at more than 50 addresses. CGTC maximizes its reach through traditional, blended, and distance education supported by state-of-the-art technology. The College offers a world-class education at tuition rates that make post-secondary education more affordable for Georgia citizens.

CGTC currently offers associate degrees, diplomas, and technical certificates of credit in the areas of Aerospace, Trade and Industry, Business and Computer Technologies, Health Sciences, Public Safety and Professional Services, and General Studies. The College also offers adult education and customized business and industry training designed to promote community and workforce development. The College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC); many CGTC programs also hold industry-specific accreditations, licensure, and approvals from various state and national agencies. CGTC students benefit from several local and state-wide articulation agreements to facilitate a smooth transfer of earned credits into four-year colleges or universities.

CGTC has a robust dual enrollment program and a formal high school, The CGTC Academy. The Academy offers high school programming under two pathways, the State legislated Dual Achievement Program (DAP) and Career Plus High School Equivalency (CPH). The Academy is accredited by Cognia through the NCA CASI, NWAC and SACS CASI.

Continuous improvement efforts also incorporate quality initiatives and Carl D. Perkins indicators. This focus on performance has led to a 95.1% Placement In-Field rate for CGTC graduates and an overall job placement rate of 100%, establishing Central Georgia Technical College as a proven pathway to high wage, high skill, and in-demand careers.

In June 2013, the consolidated College was approved by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to continue as an accredited institution with Level 1 status, with the capacity to grant associate degrees. The consolidated College officially began doing business as Central Georgia Technical College (CGTC) on July 1, 2013.




Figure 1: FY2022 Participants by Financial Aid Type



Highlights

CGTC has always employed the best use of taxpayer dollars to the people it serves. Through the management and operation of accounting, payroll and benefits, inventory and assets, facilities and other human resource functions, CGTC continues to maximize revenues to ensure the community receives the best education services possible.


During Academic Year 2022, CGTC produced more graduates and conferred more awards, as well as, had the highest enrollment (12,783) than any of the other 22 colleges in the Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG).

1. CGTC had the highest number of graduates (3,715) and conferred the highest awards (6,170):

#1 in associates degrees (1,058 conferred)
 #1 in technical certificate of credit (4,568 conferred)

#1 in HOPE Career Grant graduates (2,306)
#2 in diplomas (544 conferred)

- 2. CGTC led the TCSG in high school dual enrollment with the highest number of students (4,677), graduates (1,110), and awards (1,505 conferred):
 - > #1 in associates degrees (105 conferred)
- #5 in diplomas (61 conferred)
- #1 in technical certificate of credit (1,339 conferred)
- 3. The Adult Education Division enrolled the fourth-highest total number (1,591) of Adult Basic, Adult Secondary and English as a Second Language learners and ranked third for total Measurable Skill Gains (776) within the TCSG.
- 4. The Economic Development Division delivered Customized Contract Training to 256 companies ranking second in the TCSG, but led in training hours, totaling 4,711,487.



5. CGTC became the first TCSG College to implement an accredited high school.

Quality Initiatives

Active Grants FY2022

The Institutional Effectiveness Division provides significant support for grant applications and other competitive funding sources. As a result of these efforts, CGTC was awarded over \$4.9M in FY2022 with 60% from federal sources, 25% from local governments, 9% from philanthropic sources, and 6% from state funding as shown in the following figure.




Figure 3: FY2022 Grant & Competitive Funding by Source

During FY2022, 18 applications were submitted for grants and competitive funding totaling \$14,867,584. Of those applications, 56% have been awarded to CGTC or the CGTC Foundation resulting in an additional \$8,811,426 in funds. Four applications, valued at \$2,501,158, are still under review.

The Institutional Effectiveness Division pursues funding to support all divisions of the College. Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, (High School Initiatives and Campus Security) and the Executive Vice President (VECTR), Divisions received approximately \$1.5M from grants and

competitive funding sources to provide quality programming and services and improve student learning and success.




Figure 4: FY2022 Distributions of Funds by Division

Carl D. Perkins Grant

The Perkins grant is Federal funding provided to the College through TCSG and the Georgia Department of Education (GADOE). Allocation of funding is not competitive but based on the number of Pell recipients. The College's allocation for FY2022 was \$1,655,147 distributed among Divisions that provide eligible activities in support of grant priorities.




Figure 5: Perkins Funding Distribution Chart by Division/Unit

Perkins funds are disbursed to support, Personnel, Equipment, Travel, Professional Development, Books and Supplies, Contracts and Consultants. Perkins funding supports negotiated activities devised with internal and external stakeholder input. External stakeholders include, but are not limited, to secondary school systems, business and industry partners, and WorkSource Georgia Region 6 entities. Local Board and Foundation Board members are considered as internal stakeholders for planning purposes.




Figure 6: FY2022 Perkins Distribution of Funds of Category



Special Populations/Lending Library

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness provides grant management and technical assistance to College departments such as Special Populations. In FY2022, the Office of Special Populations, a unit of the Student Services Division, as recipients of Perkins funding, provided Lending Library services to 207 students throughout the academic year. Many students received assistance during one or more semesters in fall, spring, and/or summer semesters. Of the 207 students assisted, 78% successfully passed their courses and 7% of the students who were eligible successfully graduated from their program of study. Fifteen percent (15%) of the students receiving assistance failed their courses and were contacted by a representative from Special Populations and the TEAMS Outreach Center for intervention strategies. The Office of Special Populations projects to serve 300 individual students in academic year 2023.

REACH



TEAMS Outreach Center

CGTC TEAMS Outreach Center utilizes an internally designed alert system to identify at-risk students, provide individualized support, track the application of interventions, and monitor student success. The goal of the TEAMS Outreach Center is to improve student retention and graduation rates. This goal is met by identifying at-risk students as early in the term as possible and connecting those students to College resources or interventions that can help the student be retained and succeed.

The Academic Success Center offers free tutoring, success skills workshops, and computer assistance. Students can call, email, or schedule a session through the online platform.




Figure 8: ASC Session Count A Y2022

CGTC Academy

The <u>CGTC Academy</u> offers two alternatives to a traditional high school diploma.

Pathway 1: The <u>Dual Achievement Program Pathway</u> (DAP) offers high school coursework for individuals aged 16 – 21. Enrolled DAP students take high school courses and credit level coursework towards a minimum of two technical certificates of credit leading to an accredited high school diploma and college level credential for quick entry into the workforce. FY2022 was the implementation year for the pathway and data will be generated beginning FY2023.

Pathway 2: The <u>Career Plus High School Equivalency Pathway</u> (CPH) offers high school coursework for individuals aged 21 and over. CPH students lead to high school equivalency diploma.






Student Completion Indicator – National Student Clearinghouse (NSC)




Figure 12: Total Completion Rate by Enrollment Intensity






Figure 13: IPEDS 2022-23 Data Collection System - Completions Survey




Figure 16: IPEDS 2021-22 Prior Year Data Revision System – IPEDS Student Financial Aid (SFA) Survey Summary




Figure 17: Graduate Summary




Figure 18: Two-Year Total Award Count




Figure 19: Enrollment by CGTC County Residence
