IPEDS Outcome Data

CGTC publishes institutional outcome data on the public website for Institutional Effectiveness and Consumer Information for Public Disclosure. The College selected IPEDS 8-year award as the specified outcome measure to meet institutional accrediting requirements by SACSCOC. The IPEDS expected outcome minimum acceptable threshold for CGTC is established at 30% for the adjusted cohort receiving an award. This rate was selected based on total entering Pell Grant recipients' performance, a population that has historically been categorized as at-risk. Rates below the 30% threshold would trigger the College administration to complete an operational assessment plan to seek improvement. The 2020-2021 IPEDS Outcome Measure results indicated that the College's 8-year award rate for full-time/first-time students was 36% and 50% for part-time first-time students in the full-year cohort coverage period of July 1, 2012 - June 30, 2013, exceeding the minimum threshold.

Thank you! The TEAMS Outreach Center values collaboration with faculty and appreciates the efforts of TEAMS staff in helping students get back on track. The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted us all, and our students have suffered greatly. In spite of the changes and adjustments we have all had to make to our normal practices, you have still put our students first. The collaboration between faculty and TEAMS staff produced 2,300+ alerts this year. TEAMS alerts are reported to TCSG and our College is

ranked among other technical colleges in how well we help students get back on track. For Fall term, TCSG colleges averaged a retention rate of 52%. Kudos to CGTC, whose retention rate was 56% (4 percentage points higher than the average). As we acclimate to the challenges of this new term, there will be even more students who need support. Let's continue to work together to serve our students. When the TEAMS Outreach Center helps students succeed, it is a boost for our students and the College. Thanks for all you do to support student success!

The TEAMS Outreach Center welcomes AmeriCorps VISTA Members to the office of Institutional Effectiveness. The VISTA Members serve as Resource Specialists in the TEAMS Outreach Center. VISTA Members support the TEAMS Outreach Center in efforts to ensure that college students with academic barriers break the cycle of poverty by providing wraparound supports that help them complete workforce training that leads to employment. The VISTA project helps to build capacity by developing a sustainable recruitment and management system for the TEAMS Outreach Center. The VISTA Members are located in the TEAMS Outreach Center on the Macon campus, Room A403.



The CGTC REACH Student Organization offers informative and engaging bi-weekly sessions to promote success in postsecondary education and the workplace for all students. Summer semester topics include financial literacy, technology resources, and test

preparation strategies. REACH provides additional support for male students of color through committed mentors, community service opportunities, and leadership development activities. The REACH student organization:

- Offers "Resource Roundhouse" sessions to provide information about College resources and services (i.e. TEAMS, CARE Center, Counseling Services, SNAP, Career Services, Campus Life, and more)
- Provides opportunities to learn about and improve public speaking, professional dress, and networking skills
- Partners with the Academic Success Center and Library Services on special events (Black History Month poster series) and workshops (Being Heard July 21) geared towards student success
- Recognizes male students of color that have demonstrated leadership qualities and engaged in REACH activities
